COMPOSITE

Composite is an industrially developed stone composed of 93% quartz and 7% resin and pigments. The material is very dense, which means that fluids cannot penetrate the stone easily. The composition and the properties of the material mean that composite is very resistant to scratches and stains

Daily care

The countertop can be wiped down with a mixture of water and dish soap or some other mild soap.

Cleaning stains

Stubborn stains can be treated with a small amount of Cif Cream or organic vinegar or with a good intensive cleaner. Be sure to rinse with plenty of clean water.

Precautionary measures with use

- Remove any spills as soon as possible.
- Do not use any impregnating agents or wax. They do not penetrate the stone but simply remain on the surface due to the closed structure of composite.
- Avoid contact with strong acid and alkaline agents (pH value <5 and >10) and extremely aggressive cleaning agents such as metal cleaners, oven cleaners and drain unblockers.
- Always use a trivet for hot pans and oven dishes to avoid any risk of thermal shock.
- Always use a cutting board and do not cut directly on the worktop.
- Never sit or stand on the countertop.
- Allow a built-in dishwasher to cool off with the door closed.
